A summary of the Authority's Small and Disadvantaged Business Program and Certification

WHAT IS THE AUTHORITY'S SMALL BUSINESS PROGRAM?

The California High-Speed Rail Authority (Authority) is committed to small businesses playing a major role in building the statewide high-speed rail project. The Small Business (SB)Program has an aggressive 30% goal for small business participation including Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE), Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises (DVBE) and Micro-Businesses (MB).

The SB Program requires all primes, to develop and implement a small business performance plan to achieve the 30% goal.

Participation in ConnectHSR is free and open to all businesses. Information on firms who register will be available when current and prospective prime contractors search ConnectHSR for subcontractors by trade, region and/or certification type. Registrants will also receive notification of high-speed rail procurement opportunities and be notified of business-focused events such as Pre-Bids, Meet the Primes, Small Business Workshops, Trainings and more.
