- The Authority has not made a penalty payment in over seven years (85 months) and did not have any aged invoices in the February 2024 reporting period.
- The Authority currently has a total of \$98.3M in disputed invoices, which represents a \$327.4K decrease in total disputes from the prior month.

- The Proposition 1A cash balance rose \$109.3M month-over-month to \$167.8M. Cash expenditures were \$60.6M. The Authority has an additional \$1.3B available through commercial paper which was authorized in Spring 2024. On February 7th, 2024, the Treasure's Office issued \$170.0M in Prop 1A commercial paper.
- The Cap-and-Trade cash balance fell \$69.3M month-over-month to \$2.8B. The latest Cap and Trade auction was held February 14th, 2024, and proceeds are estimated at \$325.5M.
- The Rail Property Management Fund cash balance rose \$64.2K month-over-month to \$12.2M. Payments received totaled \$199.1K and cash expenditures were \$134.9K. The Rail Property Management Fund receives revenues from leases/rents collected on Authority-owned property, and proceeds are used for property-related expenditures.

- At 66.7% of the Fiscal Year completed, \$51.4M or 52.4% of the Administrative Budget (\$98.0M) has been spent, resulting in a budget underutilization value of 14.3%. The budget underutilization is due to position vacancies and low OE&E spending.
- As of February 2024, the Authority's vacancy rate is 16.1% and the statewide vacancy rate is 19.7%. The Authority has filled a net total of 19 positions over the past year, (from 341 to 360 filled positions).
- During the reporting month, the Authority completed recruitment for five vacant positions; however, the filled positions were offset by seven separations from the Authority and two vacated positions from internal promotions, resulting in a net increase of four vacant positions.

- At 66.7% of the fiscal year completed, YTD Capital Outlay expenditures are \$1,173.3M or 63.4% of the fiscal year budget.
- Construction Package Monthly Expenditures totaled \$82.8M, which includes: CP1: \$24.2M, CP2-3: \$44.7M, and CP4: \$14.0M.
- Design-Build (DB) Monthly Expenditures totaled \$71.5M, which includes: CP1: \$20.4M, CP2-3: \$38.1M, and CP4: \$13.1M.
- Monthly expenditures Time Impact Analysis (TIA) settlement payments totaling \$3.8M, which includes: CP1: \$0.0M, CP2-3: \$3.8M, and CP4: \$0.0M.
- The percentage of DB contract dollars expended to date for each Construction Package are as follows: CP1: 66.6%, CP2-3: 73.5%, and CP4: 97.6%.

- Contracts are predominately issued for a variety of services, such as design-build and environmental work, while purchase orders are generally used to acquire goods (i.e. office supplies).
- The Authority has 191 active contracts and 103 active purchase orders (PO's) with a total value of \$12.5B.
- Month-over-Month the value of active contracts decreased by \$261.3M. The change in value of active contracts is primarily due to the removal of completed contacts (\$341.1M); and the addition of executed change orders for design-build contracts \$38.0M, with CP1: \$6.3M, CP2-3: \$17.5M, CP4: \$14.1M; two new contracts \$907.6K; and three contract amendments \$40.9M.

- On November 2, 2023, the Board adopted new Small Business Utilization (SBU) targets. These will be reported in a revised table as more new contracts are executed with the new targets.
- The current SBU rate represents a 7.2% increase from the inception of reporting in February 2015 of 16.2%.
- SBU rates for the DBs are as follows: CP1 23.6%, CP2-3 19.7%, CP4 21.1%
- As of January 31, 2023, there are 840 small businesses actively working on the high-speed rail project, including 291 DBE's and 103 Certified DVBE's.
