Sample Projects for MATOC Evaluation:

ED-24 Relocation and construction of Pacific Gas & Electric Company (PG&E) distribution lines along Road 14 1/2, Robertson Blvd, SR152 in Chowchilla

Contractor is responsible for the installation of placement of primary enclosure boxes, installation of riser poles, placement of conduits and conductors, removal of existing lines, foundation and pole work, and coordination with existing utilities and roadway restoration per plans and specs. The Contractor shall provide proper clearance per PG&E standards, California Public Utilities Code (CPUC) GO-95 and GO-176 requirements. The Contractor shall perform all necessary civil, electrical, and structural work to facilitate the safe and compliant realignment of PG&E facilities within the designated corridor. The Contractor is responsible for all the permits required to carry out the work.



Sample Projects for MATOC Evaluation:

Well Abandonment

The Contractor shall provide the Authority with well abandonment services for Semitropic Well 6055, a ground well owned by Semitropic Water Storage District and located in Kern County.

Completion of earthen embankment and Intrusion Protection Barrier (IPB) for the HSR guideway at Canal 9-22

The scope of work for this project includes furnishing all labor, equipment, materials, tools, supervision and incidentals necessary to demolish and remove the section of open earthen canal, known as North Kern Water Storage District (NKWSD) Canal 9-22, in the HSR guideway, west of the SR-43 from approximately HSR Station 15429+80 to Station 15433+50. Additionally, the project includes the import of foreign soil to backfill the canal before constructing an earthen embankment and an earthen Intrusion Protection Barrier (IPB), approximately 1000' in length, between Station S15429+00 and S15436+00, in accordance with the approved final design and North Kern Water Storage District's standards and specifications.



Sample Projects for MATOC Evaluation:

SR46 CP4

The Contractor is responsible for the installation of new transmission and distribution structures, removal and re-stranding of existing lines, foundation and pole work, and coordination with existing utilities and roadway modifications. The Contractor will provide proper clearance per PG&E standards, California Public Utilities Code (CPUC) GO-95 and GO-176 requirements. The Contractor is responsible shall perform all necessary civil, electrical, and structural work to facilitate the safe and compliant realignment of PG&E facilities within the designated corridor.

ED-17 PG&E Electrical Distribution Relocation along Road 18 in Madera County

Contractor is responsible for the installation of steel casing across the Authority right of way, placement of two (2) primary enclosure boxes, installation of two (2) riser poles, placement of conduits and conductors, removal of existing lines, foundation and pole work, and coordination with existing utilities and roadway restoration. The Contractor shall provide proper clearance per PG&E standards, California Public Utilities Code (CPUC) GO-95 and GO-176 requirements. The Contractor shall perform all necessary civil, electrical, and structural work to facilitate the safe and compliant realignment of PG&E facilities within the designated corridor. The Contractor is responsible for all the permits required to carry out the work.
