- The Authority has not made a penalty payment in over eight years (102 months) and did not have any aged invoices in the July 2025 reporting period.
- The Authority currently has a total of \$288.4M in disputed invoices, which represents a \$18.0M decrease in total disputes from the prior month. One contract accounts for 96.6% of the dispute total.

- The estimated Aug 2025 Cap-and-Trade auction proceeds are \$99.4M and will be reported once the transaction is completed by the State Controller's Office.
- The Proposition 1A cash balance increased \$7.0M month-over-month to \$312.0M. This increase is due to \$100.0M from the June Commercial Paper Sale, \$4.6M from interest, and was offset by expenditures of \$97.5M
- The Cap-and-Trade cash balance increased \$115.7M month-over-month to \$3.94B. This increase is due to the Executive Order adjustment of \$144.4M and was offset by expenditures of \$28.7M.
- The forecasted Revenues for the Rail Property Management Fund is \$2.7M for FY25-26, based on leases from 28 commercial, 11 residential, and 17 agricultural properties. The planned FY25-26 expenditures are \$2.6M for security, maintenance, utilities, taxes, and other Authority expenses related to managing the properties.

- The 2025 Budget Act (Senate Bill 101) was chaptered on June 27, 2025, and appropriated \$117.5M to the Authority for state operations. This included funding for 18 new state positions from the three Budget Change Proposals, as well as updates for employee compensation and benefits.
- In June 2025, the Authority's FY2024-25 budget decreased by \$2,074,000 for government efficiencies reductions (Control Section 4.05 of \$641,000) and vacancy savings (Control Section 4.12 of \$1,433,000).
- At 8.3% of the Fiscal Year completed, \$6.3M or 6.3% of the Administrative Budget (\$117.5M) has been spent, resulting in a budget underutilization value of 2.0%. The budget underutilization is due to position vacancies and low OE&E spending.
- During the reporting month, the Authority completed recruitment for six vacant positions; however, the filled positions were offset by seven separations and 18 new unfilled positions, resulting in a net increase in vacant positions of 19.
- The Authority has filled a net total of 30 vacant position(s) over the past 12 months (from 357 to 387 filled positions).
- As of July 2025, the Authority's vacancy rate is 24.7% and the statewide vacancy rate is 17.0%, without the additional 18 new positions the Authority's vacancy rate would be 22.0%.




Total Expenditures by Funding Source¹

- Contracts are predominately issued for a variety of services, such as design-build and environmental work, while purchase orders are generally used to acquire goods
- The Authority has 181 active contracts and 120 active purchase orders (PO's) with a total value of \$12.68B.
- Month-over-Month the value of active contracts decreased by \$56.6M. The change in value of active contracts is primarily due to the removal of 30 expired contracts for \$165.1M. This was offset by executed change orders for design-build contracts \$101.9M (CP1: \$101.9M, CP2-3: \$0.0, CP4: \$0.0; the addition of 7 new contract(s) for \$3.0M, and amendment(s) of three contract(s) for \$3.5M.
