- The Authority has not made a penalty payment in over eight years (103 months) and did not have any aged invoices in the August 2025 reporting period.
- The Authority currently has a total of \$297.9M in disputed invoices, which represents a \$9.5M increase in total disputes from the prior month. One contract accounts for 97.2% of the dispute total.

- The estimated Aug 2025 Cap-and-Trade auction proceeds are \$98.8M and will be reported once the transaction is completed by the State Controller's Office.
- The Proposition 1A cash balance decreased by \$33.0M, due to expenditures of \$133.4M and was offset by \$101.2M from the August Commercial Paper Sale.
- The Cap-and-Trade cash balance decreased by \$28.1M, due to expenditures of \$28.1M.
- The forecasted Revenues for the Rail Property Management Fund is \$2.7M for FY25-26, based on leases from 28 commercial, 15 residential, and 17 agricultural properties. The planned FY25-26 expenditures are \$2.6M for security, maintenance, utilities, taxes, and other Authority expenses related to managing the properties.

<sup>•</sup> At 16.7% of the Fiscal Year completed, \$13.0M or 12.8% of the Administrative Budget (\$117.5M) has been spent, resulting in a budget underutilization value of 3.9%. The budget underutilization is due to position vacancies and low OE&E spending.

- The Authority has filled a net total of 38 vacant position(s) over the past 12 months (from 352 to 390 filled positions).
- As of August 2025, the Authority's vacancy rate is 24.1% and the statewide vacancy rate is 17.0%.

<sup>•</sup> During the reporting month, the Authority completed recruitment for 11 vacant positions; however, the filled positions were offset by eight separations, resulting in a net decrease in vacant positions of three.

- At 16.7% of the fiscal year completed, YTD Capital Outlay expenditures are \$257.3M or 9.5% of the fiscal year forecast.
- Construction Package Monthly Expenditures totaled \$87.5M, which includes: CP1: \$42.4M, CP2-3: \$44.9M, and CP4: \$154.9K.
- Design-Build (DB) Monthly Expenditures totaled \$70.0M, which includes: CP1: \$36.1M, CP2-3: \$33.8M, and CP4: \$0.0.
- Monthly expenditures Time Impact Analysis (TIA) settlement payments totaling \$3.0M, which includes: CP1: \$3.0M, CP2-3: \$0.0, and CP4: \$0.0.

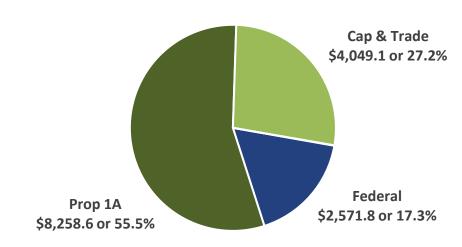

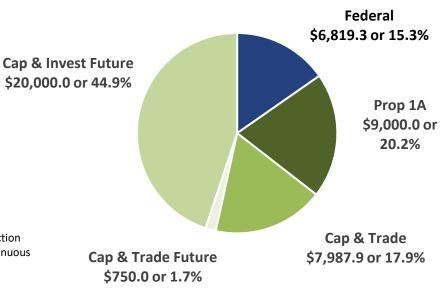

- Contracts are predominately issued for a variety of services, such as design-build and environmental work, while purchase orders are generally used to acquire goods
- The Authority has 180 active contracts and 138 active purchase orders (PO's) with a total value of \$11.91B.
- Month-over-Month the value of active contracts decreased by \$713.1M. The change in value of active contracts is primarily due to the removal of 4 expired contracts for \$702.2M. This was offset by executed change orders for design-build contracts \$3.5M (CP1: \$7.0M, CP2-3: (\$985.6K), CP4: (\$2.6M); the addition of 3 new contract(s) for \$1.2M, and amendment(s) of three contract(s) for (\$15.5M).
