- The Authority has not made a penalty payment in 43 months and did not have any aged invoices in the August reporting period.
- The Authority currently has 175 disputed invoices with a total value of \$14.5M. This is a \$314K decrease from the \$14.8M reported last month.
- The Authority's focused efforts to decrease disputes have resulted in a 47.3% or \$13M reduction from the high of \$27.5M reported in Sep-18.

Note: The total number of invoices paid and in-process will fluctuate depending on the progress of the project.

- Prop IA Bond sales are conducted twice per year by the State Treasurer's Office (STO) in the spring and fall.
- Cap and Trade auctions occur four times per year (Aug, Nov, Feb, May) and are subject to administrative adjustments by the California Air Resources Board and the Department of Finance (e.g. fire fee, manufacturing tax exemption offsets, and foreign exchange rate adjustments).
- The Rail Property Management Fund receives revenues from leases/rents collected on property acquired but not yet delivered to the Design-Builders for construction.

 These funds are annually appropriated and used for the development, improvement and maintenance of the HSR system.
- As expected, the May 2020 Cap and Trade auction was impacted by COVID-19. The auction proceeds for HSR fell from \$153M in February to approximately \$6M in the May auction. Given the state's ambitious 2030 climate reduction goals, we expect the COVID-19 impacts on revenue to primarily be short-term, with unsold allowances likely to sell in the future as the economy recovers. Proceeds from the May auction are not yet included in the Cash Balance as the journal entry has not been completed by the State Controller's Office.

Note: A Cap and Trade auction occurred on Aug 18, 2020. The preliminary share of proceeds for the Authority are estimated to be \$99M after the backfill provisions of the California Global Warming Solutions Act extension (AB398 of 2017). Proceeds will be reflected in the Cash Balance once the Executive Order is issued.

- At 16.7% of the Fiscal Year completed, 8.4% or \$6.2M of the Administrative Budget has been spent, resulting in a budget underutilization value of 8.3%. The budget underutilization is due to vacancies and low OE&E spending.
- As of August 31, 2020, the Authority's vacancy rate is 37.4%, primarily due to the addition of 85 new state positions. The Authority is working diligently to fill all its vacant positions.
- The Authority has filled 119 vacant positions (9 positions per month) since July 2019 when accounting for new hires, internal promotions, and transfers exclusively. When including separations, the Authority has filled a net of 39 vacant positions since July 2019.

- The FY2020-21 Capital Outlay Budget totals \$2.903B, which is an increase of \$648.4M or 28.8% from the prior year (FY2019-20).
- At 16.7% of the fiscal year completed, YTD Capital Outlay expenditures are \$245.8M or 8.5% of the fiscal year budget. The underutilization of budget is detailed in the table below.
- Construction Package Monthly Expenditures totaled \$117.9M, which includes: CPI \$54M, CP2-3 \$56.1M, and CP4 \$7.8M.
- Design-Build (DB) Monthly Expenditures totaled \$92.5M, which includes: CPI \$41.8M, CP2-3 \$44.2M, and CP4 \$6.5M.
- As of Aug-20, the percentage of DB contract dollars expended to date for each Construction Package are as follows: CP1: 57.9%, CP2-3: 58.5%, and CP4: 59.8%.

- The State Match to ARRA and State Match Liability table reflects FRA Approved Match to Date in the amount of \$476.7M and Pending FRA Approval in the amount of \$1,452.0M, Total Approved and Submitted to FRA in the amount of \$1,928.7M (77.3%) as of 8/31/2020.
- In addition, the Authority has \$308.1M in-process at HSRA. Of this amount, \$19.8M is being processed in the Authority's Accounting Branch and the remaining \$288.3M is expected to be submitted within the next 90 days.
- In August 2020, \$314K in refunds were processed and reported to the FRA. The new cumulative refund total is \$6.2M.
- When including FRA Approved Match to Date (\$476.7M), invoices Pending FRA Approval (\$1,452.0M), and invoices in-process at HSRA (\$308.1M), the Authority has \$2.2B (89%) in total State Match to ARRA as of 8/31/2020.

- Contracts are predominately issued for a variety of services, such as design-build and environmental work, while purchase orders are generally used to acquire goods (i.e. office supplies).
- As of August 31, 2020, the Authority had 205 active contracts and 35 active purchase orders (PO's) with a total value of \$8.2B.
- Month-over-Month the value of contracts increased \$101.4M, primarily due to change orders for CP design-build contracts and three new contracts executed.
- The Oct-20 report (Aug-20 data) reflects a Small Business Utilization Rate (SBU) of 21.4%. The current rate represents a 5.2% increase from the inception of SBU reporting in Feb-15 of 16.2%.
- The Authority anticipates SBU to increase as construction activity ramps up moving closer to the SBU goal of 30%, per the Small and Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Policy approved in Aug-12.
- As of August 31, 2020, there are **570** small businesses actively working on the high-speed rail project, including **181** DBEs and **60** Certified DVBEs. (Updates for Small Business totals are provided quarterly).
