## **Important Farmland Status Report 2015**

In April 2013, the California High-Speed Rail Authority (Authority) entered into a settlement agreement with County of Madera, Merced County Farm Bureau, Preserve Our Heritage, Chowchilla Water District, and Fagundes Parties (Petitioners). The table below shows the amount of Important Farmland (defined in the agreement) acquired, including any other unusable remainder acreage, non-economic remainder acreage or unusable remnant acreage totaling 20 acres or less (collectively, Remnant Acreage), and additionally acreage within a 25 foot wide buffer area since the Authority began acquiring land for construction of the High-Speed Rail segment in Madera and Merced Counties, as set forth in more detail in the settlement agreement.
